

## Eastern Partnership Journalistic Prize

We invite you to participate in a unique and extraordinary contest for reporters, The Eastern Partnership Journalistic Prize. If you are a journalist from one of the countries of Eastern Partnership (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine) and you feel you are devoted to the issues of democracy, human rights, the fight against abuse of power, if you think that the rapprochement with the European Union is the right path to development, and also believe in the journalistic sense of mission then announce your candidacy and take part in the competition.

Reporters Foundation in Warsaw and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Poland invite you to participate in the competition for outstanding journalism. You can win a grand prize of 10.000 PLN (about 2.400 euro) or two awards of 5.000. PLN (about 1.200 euros). Work in any genre should be sent together with a translation into Russian or English by e-mail: <a href="mailto:prize@fundacjareporterow.pl">prize@fundacjareporterow.pl</a> or <a href="mailto:ep.prize@gmail.com">ep.prize@gmail.com</a>. The deadline is 31<sup>st</sup> October 2011. The Institute of Public Affairs has become a Honorary Patron of the contest.

In early November, the finalists will be selected. They will be invited to the grand finale held in Poland, 24-25 November 2011. Preferred subjects include: investigative journalism, human rights and combating discrimination, democracy and civil society, the cooperation of the region with the European Union.

The work must meet the criteria of journalistic material in one of the main species (press, radio, television, internet) and must be published in the public domain in any medium or after 1st January 2011.

So we, the people of the Foundation, "fat cats" of journalism, are using everything what a Polish democracy is giving to us, we think that we should and have to support a new generation of reporters and independent journalists in Eastern Europe. These who have a good idea of a material "over borders", an idea of a cross-border research. To tell the stories, which we would like to listen to or to read. The best projects that inform the public opinion about significant matters.

Exchange of information and experience, contact with other journalists, is for us a step towards quality, exploring new methods of obtaining information, create a journalistic network. We want to nurture journalism that is not based on news, which already exists. We want to find information that does not escape the light of day without the intervention of journalists. We want to print documented stories. We want to be skeptical of the Public Relations fog over information. We want to give voice to journalists.

Therefore we would like together with the Foreign Ministry and the IPA introduce the Eastern Partnership Journalistic Prize.



Michal Majewski (b. 1974) - journalist of "Rzeczpospolita" daily (1994-2005). From 2006 to 2009 reporter at "Dziennik" daily. Since April 2010 working for "Rzeczpospolita" again. One of Poland's most experienced investigative reporters. Several times won the prizes from SDP (Polish Journalists Association) for investigative journalism, in 2001 he won Freedom of Speech Award. In 2007 he received Grand Press Award, the most important journalist award in Poland, in news cathegory. A winner of the Andrzej Woyciechowski Award. Co-author (with Pawel Reszka) of book "Moja wojna", interview with Waldemar Skrzypczak, former commander of the army.

Roman Daszczynski (b. 1967) - journalist of Gdansk's "Gazeta Wyborcza" daily desk. In 2004 and 2005 r. (with Krzysztof Wojcik) won Grand Press Award in news cathegory, for disclouser corruption in Gdansk University and corruption in Gdansk's city court. In 2008 won Grand Press Award (with Pawel Wiejas) in investigative journalism for series of article about sexual scandal in polish catholic church.

Paweł Reszka (b. 1969) - journalist of "Rzeczpospolita" daily since 1991 r., foreign correspondent for "Rzeczpospolita" in Moscow (2003-2006), chief of "Dziennik's" investigative desk (2006-2009). Since April 2010 working for "Rzeczpospolita" again. Tacher of journalism at University of Warsaw. Won a wide array of journalistic honors - Dariusz Fikus Award in 2005 r., several times prizes from SDP for investigative journalism. In 2007 received Grand Press Award in news cathegory. A winner of the Andrzej Woyciechowski Award. Co-author (with Michal Majewski) of book "Moja wojna". Author of "Miejsce po Imperium", reportages from Russia.

Wojciech Ciesla (b. 1972) - journalist of "Gazeta Wyborcza" daily (1998-2004), "Rzeczpospolita" daily (2004-2007), 2008-10 at investigative desk of "Dziennik" daily., since 2010 a reporter of "Wprost" weekly. Five times among the nominees for Grand Press Award in investigative reporting. In 2009 Grand Press Award Winner for investigative article about bussiness connections of Transparency International. In 2005 winner of the Andrzej Woyciechowski Award for exposing hidden process of refreshing meal at Constar food factory.
